

A year in the life of a daylily!



Gorgeous Gal, freshly dug, divided and replanted on 6/10/2010



The next day 6/11/2010 still looking the same.



Is this plant going to die? I just paid \$20.00 for it. What is going on? 6/23/2010



It isn't dead, but a lot of the original foliage is. You can see the new growth starting from the center.
Again these photos are the same plant on 6/23/2010.



On 7/12/2010 you can see that the plant has started to grow again and has even put up a scape to bloom again. I would advise that you actually cut off new scapes and let the plant put its energies into developing roots and foliage the first year. You can see a plant behind the one that was moved starting to put on new growth as well.



Well here is that same plant one year later. This photo was taken on 7/11/2011 shows that the plant not only lived but that it is now 4 fans and has had 5 bloom scapes. This flower, Gorgeous Gal, demonstrates that moving is painful even for flowers, but they do survive and can even thrive. It should be noted that I didn't do anything special to this plant. It was simply put back in the ground and allowed to grow, and grow it did.
